#### PROGRAM NOTE:

This text has inspired composers over the years and has long been a favorite of mine. I am drawn to how it interweaves the Latin with the Middle English—the sacred and the secular—to portray the full mystery of the nativity. And the metaphor of the Rose is uniquely fitting, particularly as it is employed in the verse: ‘in this rose contained was / heaven and earth in little space.’ Those humble words perfectly portray the vastness and wonder of heaven and earth joined in Mary’s womb, and the image of the densely-packed petals of a rosebud which contains so much promise in such a tiny space.

The music attempts to mirror the emotions of this great story: solo and unison lines suggest the intimacy of the events, punctuated with passages that utilize the full range and power of the voices to portray the angels singing their hymn of praise. Ultimately the music concludes with a hushed and expectant “Alleluia.”
